### The Idea

Who tells the truth in times of post-truth politics? Which is the true story of our past? What is the story of democracy in our countries? Which different stories shape societies in times of immigration and diversity? What is the story of our lives as (future) active citizens? With this project we will make stories happen; we will not just share them. We will use them to understand each other, to compare our narratives, to learn about the different paths to democracy in our countries, to understand the concept of diversity & to design our future projects as activists of civil society. **1. The truth about the past**: How did we become the people who we are? We will look at the historic narratives describing our (national) identity and our paths to democracy.

2. The truth about democracy: How do we decide, which policy will do? Is democracy always the rule of the majority? Who feels represented and who feels left behind? (simulation game & talks with political decision makers).

**3. The truth about diversity**: How do we perceive what keeps societies together? Do we have homogenous and diverse societies in Europe? Are we part of the "Christian occident"? This part is on facing diversity and handling it.

**4. The truth about development**: How do we design, what we will do? Here we will write the story of our future. eu2018\_flyer\_de882 LIT bw.docx

### Topics of the seminar program

#### Part I: Program in Bad Bevensen

- Stories we were told. Inside & outside views on our countries (first approach on intercultural learning with a specific focus on fears and prejudices)
- The true stories about our lives. Family biographies and the context of historic events
- Uncomfortable truths about democracy: Reports from the dark chapters of our societies
- The truth about diversity: field visits to NGOs dealing with current conflicts & integration
- Identity and radicalization: Democratic values and the prevention of political and religious radicalism

- The story about migration. Immigrants and migrants share their experiences (talk with time witnesses; events of world politics; statue theatre)
- Generation mix: Super-diversity in the era of immigration. (simulation game: participants create the society of the future)

### Part II: Program in Berlin

- Diversity without majority. The new concept of immigration and anti-alarmist approaches (down-to-earth projects in Berlin-Neukölln)
- The truth about society: Politicians share their vision on a multicultural society. (Talk with a representative of the German government)
- The truth about responsibility: participants develop project modules for follow-up activities
